In 2024, Zaporizhzhia topped the Transparency International Ukraine ranking for the fastest growth in transparency indicators. The city took the **12th position in the national transparency ranking**. This is the greatest progress among 100 municipalities in Ukraine during the full-scale war. Over one year, the city's transparency score increased from 36.7% to 63%.

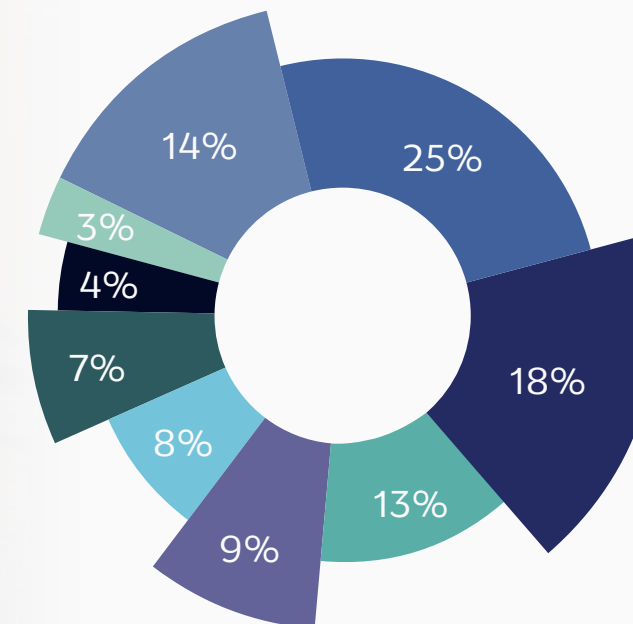

CENTERS FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES (CNAP)

496 services for city residents are provided through CNAP.






169 services for businesses — services in the field of registration of legal entities, individual entrepreneurs, permit-related services, services in architecture and urban planning, and state registration of real estate.

6 centers — one in each district of the city.

- Registration of a legal entity and amendments to its statutory information.
- Registration of a sole proprietor (FOP) and selection of activity codes (KVED).
- State registration of property rights and related real estate services.
- Issuance of permit documents.
- Issuance of urban planning conditions and restrictions for land plots.
- Administrative services related to transport operations, public amenities, public utilities, and housing.
- Consultations on procedures and requirements for obtaining administrative services.

In the city, **5 business communities operate**, facilitating experience exchange and mutual support in solving business tasks, finding partners, and attracting investments. They provide businesses with access to mentors and support Zaporizhzhia manufacturers in entering export markets through cooperation with entrepreneurs from other countries.





CITY DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY


The City Development Strategy of Zaporizhzhia for **the period until 2028** was developed with the support of the project “Partnership for Urban Development” (PROMIS).

The Urban Resilience Strategy of Zaporizhzhia was developed by the City Council together with the community and experts from the urban coalition Ro3kvit. It outlines the principles and opportunities for sustainable community development under conditions of uncertainty and challenges. It also serves as a foundation for updating Zaporizhzhia’s Development Strategy and urban planning documents.

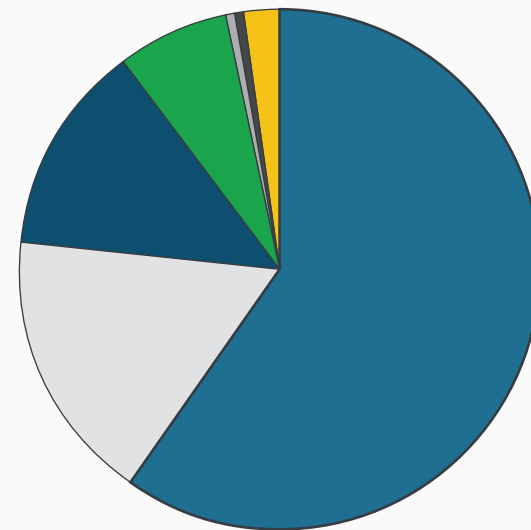
The revenue part of the budget of the Zaporizhzhia municipal territorial community for 2024 amounted to **10,912.8 mln UAH**.

The annual plan for general fund revenues (2024) was fulfilled at **102.6%**.

RESILIENCE CENTER

A space where residents of Zaporizhzhia can receive **psychological and social support**. This is the first municipal center in Zaporizhzhia designed to provide enhanced assistance to people affected by the war. Its main goal is to preserve mental health, reduce stress and anxiety levels among the population, and support social adaptation in crisis conditions.



Since the opening of the Center, specialists have **received 1,667 requests**. More than **600 residents of Zaporizhzhia** have participated in group activities, trainings, and consultations. Most often, people seek psychological support to overcome stress and restore inner balance. During this period, **308 psychosocial support activities** have been conducted.



SOCIAL TAXI

The Social Taxi service has been operating since the beginning of 2025 and has already completed **more than 2,400 trips**. Thanks to this social service, people with disabilities can reach hospitals, rehabilitation centers, banks, Administrative Service Centers (CNAPs), and other essential institutions. The vehicles operating as social taxis are specially equipped to transport people with limited mobility, including those who use wheelchairs. More than **260 residents of Zaporizhzhia** have used the service since the beginning of the year.

RESILIENCE DURING WAR

Caring for people affected by war is a priority for Zaporizhzhia city authorities.

Comprehensive Social Protection Program

More than 500 families whose homes were damaged received approximately 94.5 million UAH in compensation.

Additional One-Time Assistance

Provided to people with disabilities, large families, and subsidy recipients.

Humanitarian Response

Psychological, legal, and humanitarian assistance at emergency sites. Provided by city services in partnership with partner organizations.

INVESTMENT PROJECTS

DREAM (Digital Restoration Ecosystem for Accountable Management) – is a state digital ecosystem that creates a single "digital pipeline" for reconstruction and modernization projects in Ukraine, ensuring transparency, accountability, and control at all stages.



SAFETY AND SECURITY

Construction of Safe Spaces (coworking, conference spaces, factory kitchens)

Description: Creation of multifunctional shelters that, in peacetime, serve as sports halls, conference zones, or coworking spaces.

Estimated cost: ~420 million UAH



Major Renovation of Shelters in Schools and Hospitals

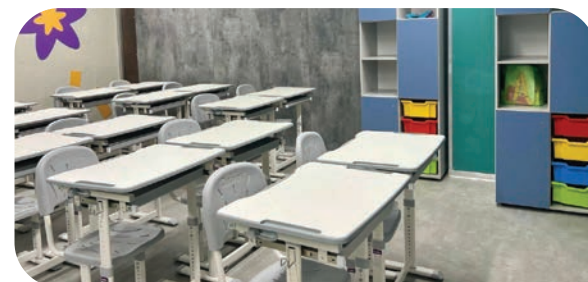
Description: Modernization of shelters in educational and medical facilities—ventilation, waterproofing, sanitary facilities, lighting, and communications.

Estimated cost: 10-42 million UAH

Safety Equipment for Schools

Description: Establishing safe conditions in general secondary education institutions, including fire protection systems, video surveillance in schools, and other safety measures.

Estimated cost: approximately 50 million UAH



ECONOMIC RESILIENCE



New Construction of Cogeneration Plants at Municipal Facilities

Description: Energy-efficient solution for hospitals, schools, and municipal facilities – simultaneous production of heat and electricity.

Estimated cost: ≈ 2.3 billion UAH

Implementation of Alternative Energy in the Municipal Sector

Description: Transition to solar, wind, and bioenergy.

Estimated cost: ≈ 30-50 million UAH/year



Water Resource Management

Description: Creation of a treatment, reuse, and decentralized water supply system for educational, healthcare, and humanitarian infrastructure.

Estimated cost: 185 million UAH

Reconstruction of Zaporizhzhia's Centralized Heating System

Description: Modernization of pipes, heating substations, and installation of cogeneration units.

Estimated cost: >200 million UAH



SPATIAL RESILIENCE

Park Reconstruction and City Greening

Description: Safe, inclusive spaces for recreation with landscaping, lighting, and shelters.

Estimated cost: 70 million UAH



Major Renovation of Library Facilities

Description: Improving the conditions for providing basic cultural services by modernizing the material and technical infrastructure.

Estimated cost: approximately 200 million UAH.

SOCIAL RESILIENCE

Veterans Social Centers

Description: Veteran support centers: one-stop services including psychological support, legal assistance, and housing.

Estimated cost: ~ 200 million UAH



Establishment of Centers of Vocational Excellence

Description: Modern equipment for STEM education, 3D printers, multimedia panels, and updating club facilities.

Estimated cost: 35-60 million UAH

Hospital Building Reconstruction

Description: Modernization of traumatology, cardiology, and surgery facilities according to energy efficiency and accessibility requirements.

Estimated cost: 250 million UAH



Social Housing

Description: Construction and reconstruction of housing for internally displaced persons, people with disabilities, and large families.

Estimated cost: 100-200 million UAH

Municipal Public Transport Fleet Renewal

Description: The project involves the purchase of new buses and trams to replace worn-out transport. The goal is to provide accessible and environmentally friendly transportation and expand the route network.

Estimated cost: ~200 million UAH



Specialized Municipal Equipment Fleet Renewal


Description: The initiative involves the purchase of specialized equipment for the city's municipal services. It will improve emergency recovery operations and infrastructure resilience in wartime conditions.


Estimated cost: 30 million UAH

 **16 facilities** — a network of municipal primary and secondary healthcare institutions.

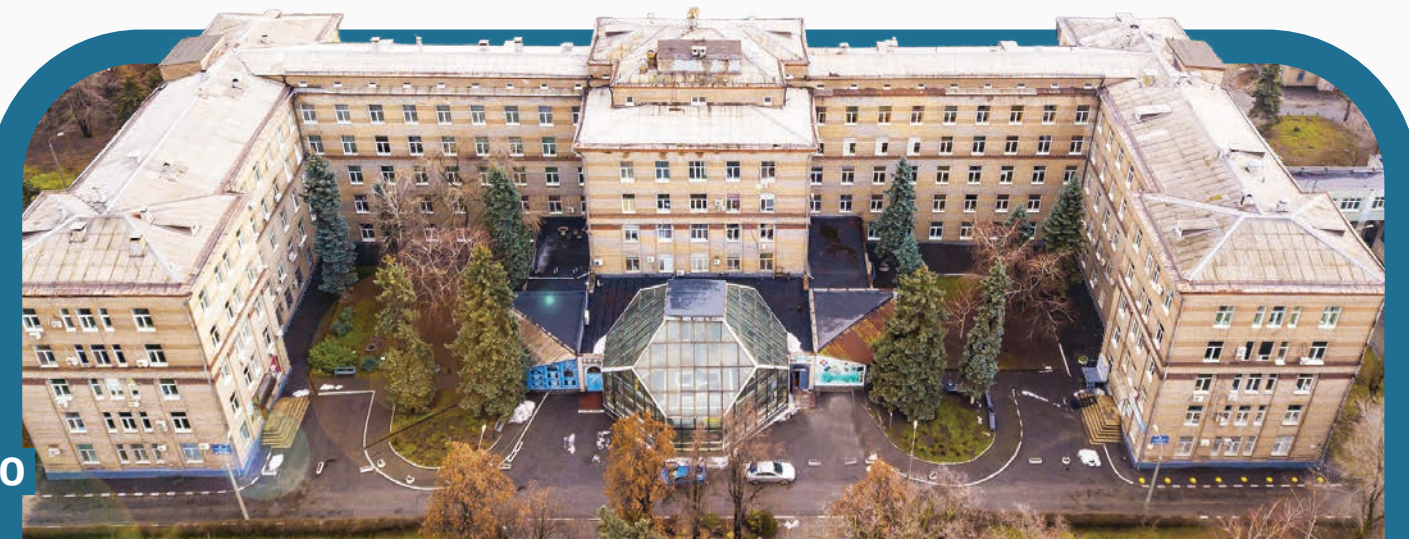

Optimization of healthcare facilities — improving management efficiency and reducing costs.

Extensive network of private medical facilities at all levels: multifunctional hospitals, primary healthcare, diagnostic, dental, and other services.

Zaporizhzhia doctors have unique expertise that includes treating complex injuries, emergency response, and providing care to the population in wartime conditions. They are ready to share their experience with colleagues from other countries and are eager to master modern European treatment methods. We are interested in building partnerships for the implementation of educational programs and internships for doctors, joint research initiatives, and virtual training.



TOURISM, CULTURE, AND LEISURE


The territory of Zaporizhzhia contains **288 cultural heritage monuments**:

 **124** historical monuments

 **11** monuments of science and technology

 **18** monuments of monumental art

 **52** archaeological monument

 **83** architectural and urban planning monuments

Khortytsia Island is a favorite destination for residents and tourists, combining unique natural landscapes, numerous historical and cultural monuments, and modern tourism opportunities.

The National Reserve "Khortytsia" was one of the most visited tourist locations in Ukraine (before the full-scale invasion).



Throughout 2024, the city hosted over **1,500 public cultural and artistic events**, which were attended by **more than 200,000 people**.

Among them were more than 30 personal and thematic exhibitions and 5 major art festivals and forums:

The City Youth Center is a modern, inclusive space where dozens of events for young people take place every week. It is a place where youth can learn new skills, implement their ideas, and participate in important events. The city also has a regional youth center and several other youth hubs. There is also the Ko_Laba educational and technical center, where young people master robotics, 3D modeling, and modern technologies.

Zaporizhzhia has **14 modern city libraries**. These are multifunctional spaces with a wide range of services — from language courses to art therapy events. Every year, the libraries hold up to 3,000 events, including exhibitions, lectures, master classes, workshops, and creative projects. In addition, five libraries host around-the-clock Points of Invincibility and basic shelters.

In 2024, the two-day festival **"Chytai Forum Zaporizhzhia" (Read Forum Zaporizhzhia)** was held for the first time, organized by the Department of Culture and Tourism and city libraries. This event brought together a book fair, author presentations, exhibitions, discussions, and children's zones. In 2025, the festival was held for the second time.



Zaporizhzhia is home to the Zaporizhzhia Academic Regional Ukrainian Musical and Drama Theater named after V. H. Mahara, Zaporizhzhia Regional Theater for Young Audiences, Zaporizhzhia Regional Puppet Theater, the open theater platform "Actor's House," and the Zaporizhzhia Regional Philharmonic named after M. Glinka.



INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION



UNICEF implements a number of large-scale projects covering support for children, youth, families, and the social sector: 16 digital educational centers, opening of youth spaces, shelter arrangements, and underground schools.



GIZ implements projects for the restoration of critical infrastructure, enhancement of the city's energy resilience, support for local government, and numerous initiatives for local governance development and business support.



The German Development Bank KfW supports projects in Zaporizhzhia Oblast in the areas of energy, healthcare, education, water supply, housing for internally displaced persons, social infrastructure, and municipal development.



UNDP implements projects on security, social support, healthcare, education, and local capacity development, contributing to the stabilization and recovery of the region in wartime conditions. Mobile police office, Mobile Administrative Service Centers, dialogue platform "Zaporizhzhia Oblast 2025: Resilience and Development."



The International Finance Corporation (IFC) supports Zaporizhzhia in implementing a smart city strategy, developing electric transport, reconstructing roads, digitalizing, forming public-private partnerships, and improving the city's investment capacity.



UNHCR supports projects for multi-purpose cash assistance to internally displaced persons, housing repairs (in partnership with Caritas Zaporizhzhia), organization of registration points for assistance, and coordination of humanitarian response in frontline areas.



UNFPA implements programs in Zaporizhzhia on access to reproductive health, psychosocial support, combating gender-based violence, and family planning, particularly through mobile teams and local partnerships.



The French company BETEN Ingenierie provides Zaporizhzhia with projects on waste management and use of renewable energy sources, including solar, wind, biomass, and water treatment.



The International Organization for Migration provides assistance to internally displaced persons, large families, and people with disabilities: installing water towers in communities in partnership with Dan Church Aid, Norwegian Church Aid, and Kirkens Nødhjelp with support from the Humanitarian Fund for Ukraine.



Chemonics, through the PFRU program in Zaporizhzhia, supports local initiatives that help strengthen the community and promote the city's unity and resilience.



Danida Sustainable Infrastructure Finance (DSIF) implemented in Zaporizhzhia the modernization of wastewater treatment facilities (high environmental standards), introduction of anaerobic sludge storage and biogas, as well as technical assistance and staff training – thanks to partnership with NEFCO.



NEFCO implements projects for the reconstruction of outdoor lighting networks in the Dniprovskyi district of Zaporizhzhia.



The third phase of the "U-LEAD with Europe" program (2025-2027) is aimed at supporting communities in reconstruction, implementing reforms, and European integration through training, consultations, and international partnership.



The Foundation implements projects "We Will Stand Together," "SHE Hub," women's potential development and financial capacity programs, support for women's leadership and entrepreneurship.



UK-MED works on emergency response: medical equipment supply, mobile clinics, surgical support, and training for specialists.



The European Commission supports the development of the Zaporizhzhia European Digital Innovation Hub (ZP EDIH), which promotes digitalization of SMEs and the public sector.



STEP IN provides medical assistance, supplies hospitals with medicines, organizes mobile medical teams, and conducts training for local rescuers in first aid and psychological support.



The Federal Agency for Technical Relief of Germany (THW) in Zaporizhzhia provides technical support, helps restore infrastructure, and trains local emergency services.



SISTER CITIES

Zaporizhzhia has a long-standing tradition of partnership with sister cities. Our cooperation encompasses humanitarian support and joint projects that strengthen public infrastructure, promote cultural exchange, and implement best practices in public administration.

CITY DEVELOPMENT INSTITUTE OF ZAPORIZHZHIA



The Municipal Institution "City Development Institute of Zaporizhzhia" (CDIZ) coordinates the city's cooperation with partners in the areas of development and recovery. These include global and international organizations, Ukrainian and foreign municipalities, municipal institutions, charitable foundations, civil society organizations, and businesses. This cooperation is carried out within specific projects, through the provision of humanitarian, charitable, or technical assistance, or other joint actions in the interests of Zaporizhzhia.



CDIZ helps local, foreign, and international partners implement important projects and provide support for Zaporizhzhia, ensures transparency in cooperation with the city, and maximizes the effective allocation of aid.

- Communication support at all stages of cooperation.
- Facilitation of interaction with the city council, municipal enterprises and institutions, local civil society organizations, and businesses.
- Up-to-date information about community needs.
- Expertise in project management, fundraising, and cross-sectoral cooperation.
- Transparent distribution of aid—where it is needed most.

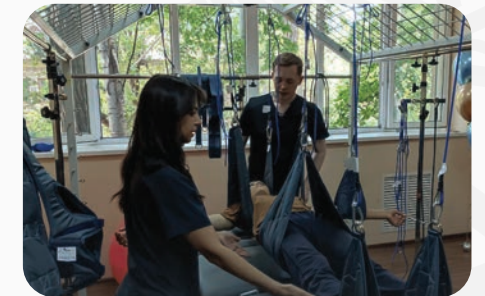
INVITATION TO COLLABORATE

Zaporizhzhia is open to international cooperation, seeking new partnerships and implementing joint projects that meet community needs and support the city's sustainability, recovery, and sustainable development.

Strengthening the Rehabilitation Center at City Hospital No. 4—a joint initiative with the city of Oberhausen (Germany), implemented under the Nakopa program (2024-2025).

Social Taxi at the Inclusive Resource Center—a project funded by the Government of Japan under the "Kusanone" program, aimed at improving mobility for people with disabilities (2024).



PROJECT DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT

In cooperation with the Zaporizhzhia City Council, civil society organizations, and UNICEF, the first City Youth Center project was developed and implemented.

Modular settlement for internally displaced persons with support from UNHCR coordination and management of cooperation.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES: PROGRAMS FOR YOUTH AND PROFESSIONALS

180 students from 16 schools and gymnasiums participated in cultural and educational exchanges in Austria, Germany, Finland, and Greece in 2025.

A delegation of Zaporizhzhia doctors visited the AMEOS Reha Zentrum and ZAR rehabilitation centers in Oberhausen as part of a training visit.
